Introduction: The focus of this Fellowship is to provide opportunities for individuals with supervised clinical practice to refine their clinical skills in preparation for functioning as independent practitioners in a university mental health setting. Clinical Fellows join a dynamic team of health and mental health care professionals, including psychiatrists, social workers, marriage and family therapist, and licensed professional counselors. The primary role of the Clinical Fellow is to provide clinical services using their experiences from completion of an internship program or other relevant experience. “Learning by doing” is the philosophical foundation of the training as Fellows focus on the provision of individual and group psychotherapy to UWM students. The Fellows will also have the opportunity to hone their outreach and prevention skills as they work with a number of campus resources to support UWM students. Requirements include a master's degree in counseling/counselor education, social work, marriage and family therapy, or related field, working toward independent licensure. For the disciplines of social work and counseling, applicants must have degrees conferred and have obtained their APSW or LPC-IT license for the State of Wisconsin by August 1, or the first day of the Fellowship. A supervised internship or equivalent work in a university counseling center, mental health agency or related professional clinical setting is preferred. General skills, knowledge, and experience in individual, relationship, group counseling and psychotherapy, assessment, multicultural issue, and crisis intervention.


