Admissions Requirements

Bachelor's Degree Programs

- Completion of a minimum of 84 quarter or 56 semester units of transfer credit
- Completion of general education requirements

Master's Degree Programs

- Must hold a Bachelor's degree from a regionally-accredited institution or the international equivalent
- Online application through psychologyCAS (Application fee)

Clinical Psychology Doctoral Programs

- Must hold a Bachelor's degree from a regionally-accredited institution or the international equivalent
- Online application through psychologyCAS (Application fee)
- PhD & PsyD Prerequisites:
 - › General Psychology
 - › Abnormal or Personality Psychology
 - › Biopsychology or Physiological Psychology
 - › Developmental Psychology
 - › Statistics
- PsyD Applicants: In addition to coursework, we strongly recommend related volunteer or work experience in mental health, as well as exposure to research.
